The acceptance of trading by new investors could potentially resume at any time, subject to the discretion of PFSL.

What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests directly or indirectly through other mutual funds in Canadian, U.S. and other international fixed income securities. They can be of any size and from any industry.

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How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

PFSL has rated the volatility of this fund as low.

Because this is a new fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by PFSL Generally, the rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- are investing for the short to medium term;
- want an investment that emphasizes income generation with safety and relative stability of principal; and
- have a low tolerance for risk.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay tax on any money you make on the fund including your share of the fund's earnings and on taxable capital gains from redeeming your investment. How much tax you pay depends on your tax rate, whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan and the type of earnings of the fund (interest, dividends, capital gains, etc.). In general, you do not pay tax on your investments held in a registered retirement savings plan, tax-free savings account or other registered plan.

If you hold your investment outside of a registered plan, you will receive a tax slip showing your share of the fund's earnings. You must include the amounts shown in your income whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested. You must calculate your taxable capital gains from a redemption.

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How much does it cost?

The following table shows the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell units of the fund. The fees and expenses including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

You pay a sales charge when you buy the fund, as set out in the table below. For investors who purchased other Concert[™] Funds prior to May 31, 2022 under a low load or deferred sales charge option and who switch into the fund, no sales charge is applicable. In such cases, the applicable sales charge schedule applicable at the time of original purchase will continue to apply until expiry.

2. Fund expenses

The fund's expenses are made up of the management fee, operating expenses and trading costs. The annual management fee is 1.39% of the fund's net asset value. The management fee represents the weighted average of the management fees paid by each of the underlying funds comprising the holdings of the fund calculated as of October 31, 2024 plus an additional amount up to 0.10% borne directly by the fund. Because this fund is new, it's operating expenses and trading costs are not vet available.

More about trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice your representative and their firm provide you.

The underlying fund manager pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose:

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	2% of the value of units you sell within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the value of the units you switch to another Concert [™] Fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive the trade confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
